## **ALL STUDENTS:**

### When to Go to School:

- ✓ No fever for 24 hours
- ✓ Has energy to participate in school activities
- ✓ Occasional Cough
- ✔ Feels good
- ✓ No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours

# When to Stay Home:

- ✓ Fever of 100.4° or higher
- ✓ Feels too sick to participate in school activities
- ✓ Moderate to severe cough
- ✓ Shortness of breath
- ✓ Stomach pain
- ✓ Sore throat
- ✓ Vomiting
- ✓ Diarrhea
- ✓ Neck Pain
- Rash
- ✓ Bloodshot eyes
- ✓ Feel extra tired
- ✓ Needs fever or pain medication to feel good

#### **FOR STUDENTS WITH ASTHMA:**

### When to Go to School:

- ✓ Slight wheeze
- ✓ In Green Zone on Asthma Action Plan

# When to Stay Home:

- Sleepless night due to asthma symptoms
- ✓ Significant wheezing, coughing, shortness of breath
- Experiencing asthma flare that is not well controlled with quick relief medication
